AMSA recognises outstanding Men's Sheds and Shedders at National Gathering

Outstanding Men's Sheds and individual contributors to the Men's Shed movement were recognised at the Australian Men's Shed Association Shedder's Ball Gala Dinner in Albury (NSW).

As part of the Association's 9th National Men's Shed Gathering, the 2022 Shed Awards recognise Men's Sheds going above and beyond for members and their communities and individuals for their contributions to the Men's Shed movement.

The "Ted Donnelly Award" recognising outstanding and lifelong contributions to the Men's Shed movement was awarded virtually this year – with recipients being unable to attend the dinner.

"This award – aptly named after the longest serving Shedder in the world and Australia's 'Grandfather of Men's Sheds' – prestigiously acknowledges individuals who have played an exceptional and fundamental role in building a Men's Shed movement that now comprises of over 3,500 Men's, Women's and Community Sheds across 12 countries," said AMSA Chairman Paul Sladdin.

Bill Johnstone (Fremantle Men's Shed, Western Australia) and Graeme Curnow (Kenmore Men's Shed, Queensland) were both recognised for their efforts in the establishment and development of the Australian Men's Shed Association, as well as their respective state organisations and local Men's Sheds at grassroots level.





"I'm really proud to be associated with a pantheon of men who have done so much for the Men's Shed movement to improve the social environment for men," Mr Curnow.

Ruth McGowan (Tongala Men's Shed, Victoria) and Maxine Chaseling (Goolwa Men's Shed, South Australia) were inducted into the AMSA Hall of Fame in acknowledgment of their founding roles and ongoing support of the respective Men's Sheds. These Men's Sheds were among the very first in Australia (the home of Men's Sheds) almost 30 years ago.

"I struck the match but fortunately it was the right time and the primary health strategy was simple and doable in any community," Mrs Chaseling humbly acknowledged her role in founding the first Shed in Goolwa.

The 2022 National Men's Shed Awards, supported by AMSA's major partner Fair Dinkum Builds, were also announced recognising seven Men's Sheds across six categories, following nominations submitted earlier this year.

Members of the Wodonga Men's Shed (Victoria) attended the Shedder's Ball to accept their award for 2022 Shed of the Year.

"The Shed of the Year award is not about shed size or membership numbers. This year we were looking for (and found) a shed doing excellent things within the shed, as well as alongside community members and most exceptionally creating value for Men's Sheds across the country," said Mr Sladdin.

The Wodonga Men's Shed was established over 10 years ago and despite shared challenges over the last few years has continued to fundraise and support community groups and has retained almost 100 members – demonstrating resilience and adaptability.

The Shed is well respected in the community and enjoy excellent community support.

The results of a shed member screening in 2020 revealed an unhealthy level of visceral fat in many of the members. So the shed went about implementing a health intervention for older men asking them to achieve a measurable goal as a group project: to reduce the girth of participants by one metre in total.

Black Dog Ride supporting Men's Sheds standing shoulder to shoulder for shedder wellbeing

At our 9th National Men's Shed Gathering last month we launched our shedder wellbeing framework *Shed Mates – standing shoulder to shoulder for shedder wellbeing*, with support from national mental health awareness charity Black Dog Ride.

"Through the Shed Mates initiative AMSA will deliver information, resources and a network of supports for Men's Shed committees and members working towards maintaining and improving the wellbeing of older Australians across the Men's Shed community," said AMSA Executive Officer David Helmers.

The Shed Mates initiative builds on work already done by Men's Sheds all over the country, providing a framework of engagement and implementation strategies and activities to enhance shedder wellbeing.

"We are grateful for the support of Black Dog Ride in enhancing expanding our reach," Mr Helmers said.

It's a great fit for the organisations, who both work to enhance mental health and wellbeing for Australians through grassroots activities.

"Shed Mates aligns closely with the Black Dog Ride's values and our goals of de-stigmatising the debilitating effects of mental health, which effects so many," said Black Dog Ride General Manager Lawson Dixon.

The first phase of the initiative will be rolled out across the Men's Shed community through a series of national Men's Shed and community events throughout 2022.

AMSA has taken the guesswork out of insurance by supporting sheds and community groups with a simple to obtain package, which includes all your insurance requirement (and then some).

The package includes the following policies and is priced at \$28.00 per member (minimum 15):

- \$40,000,000 Public Liability any one claim
- \$40,000,000 Products Liability in the aggregate
- \$10,000,000 Association Liability
- Voluntary Workers Personal Accident
- Group Personal Accident (for Mutual Obligation participants)
- Property providing coverage up to \$100,000 for assets owned by the Shed/group
- \$15,000 for any one claim for Burglary Cover
